DID YOU KNOW?

Way back in May 1928 a gentleman by the name of Frank Whitfords, of Whitfords Limited, approached the Wanneroo Road Board asking for a road to be built, running west from Wanneroo Road to the beach.

He was of the opinion that the stretch of beach frontage at North Beach was the 'finest on the coast'.and was convinced the area would eventually be developed. He submitted a plan suggesting where the road could be routed. Forty years on, Whitfords area was developed and divided into major suburbs.

Hillarys was named after Mr Bertram John Hillary who settled in the area during the Great Depression, building a boat shed on the beach back in 1930. As he had four children, the shed had to be expanded. The family were the only known residents in the area, the nearest store being some 5 km away in North Beach.

During WWII the Australian Army used the area and named it 'Hillary's Beach'.

In 1955 the Metropolitan Region Scheme proposed that Whitford Beach, just beyond what is known as Hillarys north, would be the limit of coastal settlement.

Sadly Bert's shack was destroyed in a severe storm in 1964, shortly after Bert passed away in 1957.

In 1967 a road to Whitford Beach was built and the R & I Bank began developing the Whitford precinct, planning a town centre which became Westfield Whitford City

Whitford City officially opened in November 1978, initially boasting an Aherns Department Store. Around 1985 Big W opened its doors, along with a Woolworths supermarket and fifty specialty stores.
