Conduct your own home security audit: Make it harder for the burglars:

- a) Check security and lock doors and windows
- b) Know your neighbours
- c) Keep front yard visibly clear by keeping trees and shrubs trimmed
- d) Install sensor lights if possible
- e) Mark and list valuable property
- f) Have locks and deadbolts or deadlocks fitted if possible
- g) Instal automatic light timer or sensor lights
- h) Keep entrances well lit.
- Make sure the garage or shed i) are kept locked
- Store tools and ladders away. i)
- k) Lock the meter box
- 1) Remember a dog is a great deterrent
